CONFERENCE TRAVEL SCHOLARSHIPS



Applications are open for travel scholarships to help emerging leaders in fundamental care attend this year's ILC Conference and the Fundamental Care Leadership Program in Oxford, UK.

Six scholarships are available for 2024. There are two scholarships for each of the three ILC Regional Networks to allocate. Each Regional Network will support one Conference Scholarship and one combined Conference/Leadership Program scholarship.

Conference Scholarship

The Scholarship value is capped at a total value of \$AUD2,400 which consists of up to \$AUD1,750 towards travel and accommodation for the 2024 ILC Annual International Conference and a free Conference ticket.

Conference & Leadership Program Scholarship

The Scholarship value is capped at a total value of \$AUD5,500 which consists of up to \$3,500 towards travel and accommodation to attend the 2024 ILC Annual International Conference & Leadership Program in Oxford and a free ticket for both events.


AUSTRALIAN FUNDAMENTAL CARE LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Codesigning a Nursing Leadership Program to Transform Value and Delivery Systems for Fundamental Care

Fundamental care is often considered the foundation of nursing practice, underpinning seminal nursing theories as well as frameworks and guidelines for care delivery.

Despite the centrality of fundamental care to nursing practice and care outcomes, internationally, care recipients report negative experiences of this care.

To support nursing leaders in changing deeply entrenched organisational cultures and value systems on fundamental care, they must have the knowledge and skills to advocate for this care in a politically informed way and to foster sustainable change.

The International Learning Collaborative (ILC) is supporting nursing leaders to develop the skills required to affect real systems change for fundamental care.

Bedside nurses' perspective on the Fundamentals of Care framework and its application in clinical practice

A changing nursing workforce and an increase in demands for care together with more complex care, raise arguments that leading and guiding nursing practice is more challenging than ever. Therefore, nurses need to have a shared agenda and a common language to show the importance of nursing care and the consequences of not addressing this in an appropriate way. In response to this the Fundamentals of Care framework was developed to also contribute to the delivery of person-centred care in an integrated way. However, to gain acceptance and applicability we need to ensure the framework's relevance to clinical practice from bedside nurses' perspectives.

Spanish adaptation of the Fundamentals of Care Framework: White paper in Spanish and English

AFundamental care combines the needs of the person being cared for with the caregiver's actions. The approach is not just about addressing an individual's physical needs but about understanding and addressing the psychosocial and relational needs of the person receiving care while providing support, generating trust, and associated appropriate actions and behaviours. It is a relationship process that takes place within the framework of an organisation with solid policies and systems that place the person at the centre of attention while enabling workers' job satisfaction. These fundamental needs are only met through a positive and trusting relationship with the care recipient, including their family and everyone involved.
