2024 CONFERENCE WRAP UP

The 2024 Annual International Conference was held in Oxford, UK on the 7th & 8th of June 2024. The event gathered over 190 people in-person and online, from 16 countries to discuss Empowering Care Excellence - embedding the fundamentals of care into practice, research, education and policy.

The Conference was opened by Chief Nurse for Oxford University Hospital NHS Trust, Dr Yvonne Christley, who set the tone for the two days by encouraging participants to “go change the world”.

Professor Alison Leary, our opening speaker is a workforce expert and modeler. She spoke of normalised poor care, deprofessionalisation of nursing and delegation of the most complex and risky work to the least trained and lowest paid care workers. Prof Leary inspired participants to focus on proficiency, not just competency. Proficiency is about managing risk, with competency failing to contextualise risk. She spoke about nurses and care professionals having the skill to understand what care trade-offs you can make when caring for a patient with complex needs. Understanding the consequences of those trade-offs in care was critical to ensuring better outcomes and less harm for patients. “Nursing is a profession of vigilance”, she said.

FUNDAMENTALS OF CARE LEADERSHIP & MENTORING PROGRAM (LAMP) - OXFORD, UK

After the 2024 Conference, the ILC held the Fundamentals of Care Leadership & Mentoring Program (LAMP) in Oxford.

There were 28 participants in this year's program with strong representation from the UK & Sweden. The feedback from participants shows us that people felt supported and enthused to take on leadership roles within their organisation to improve fundamental care.



All participants left with a draft project plan for their leadership activity when they return home. They were assigned two Mentors to work with over the 12 months. We will be compiling case studies for each of the projects as a resource for Members.

The ILC's FoC Leadership & Mentoring Program (LAMP) aims to empower current and emerging nursing and healthcare leaders in research, education, practice, or policy to challenge and change how fundamental care is prioritised and actioned within healthcare systems in their own organisation, and contribute to the global efforts to value, own, do, talk and research fundamentals of care.

Participants in the Fundamentals of Care LAMP gain:

- unprecedented access to global experts in fundamentals care
- networking opportunities for sharing of ideas and best practice
- a better understanding of competing priorities in different contexts and strategies to overcome these
- ideas and skills to increase awareness, recognition, and commitment to fundamentals of care
- a shared understanding of the fundamentals of care
- effective strategies to influence and lead for change
- national and international connections for collaboration that have real impact
- a toolkit to help jumpstart change


Start your 12-month fundamentals of care leadership and mentoring program with international experts.
