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GENERAL INFORMATION

BACKGROUND

Over the last two years, global health and health care have been under immense strain on multiple levels, including a global pandemic, natural and humanitarian disasters, and scarce health care resources. 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Abstract Submission Guidelines

Abstracts must be submitted **online** by **Monday, 7 February 2022**. No other means of submission will be considered.

1. All details must be completed online so that the automated system can process your submission.
2. The person submitting the abstract is the person who will receive all correspondence in relation to the abstract.

Abstracts must showcase your work in relation to this year's theme. In your abstract, please specify the following:

- Title of presentation
- Main institution/organisation which the research/paper can be attributed to
- Author and co-authors names and institutions
- Presenters' names and institutions

The format for your presentation:

- i. The abstract must be a maximum of **300** words in length, excluding the title, authors/co-authors and institution.
- ii. A 20-minute oral presentation (10 or 15-minute presentation followed by 5-10 minutes of discussion/questions)
4. Research based papers should be structured to include an introduction/purpose, methods, results and conclusions. All other papers should be structured to include an introduction, main body and conclusion.
5. Presentations from individuals or groups are welcome

SELECTION PROCESS & ACCEPTANCE NOTIFICATION

- Once we have received abstracts, the Steering Group will review them and consider how they fit into this year's theme and program.
- It is anticipated that the submitting author will be notified of their abstract submission outcome via email no later than Monday, 14 March 2022.
